

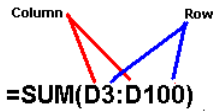
# Sum of Budget Entries in MIP Fund Accounting

**Question:** When entering a budget worksheet, how do I get a sum of all of the values that I have entered?

**Answer:** It is similar to an Excel formula. The Command for Sum is **=SUM(D3:D100)**



Where D represents the column that contains the dollar amounts. The 3 and the 100 are made up numbers. You would put the starting and ending rows you wish to add together in their place. See sample below.
